SPRING CLEANING volunteers are needed to assist local agency on April 17, for a day to clean the agency inside and out. Lunch will be served to all volunteers. All ages welcome.

YARN DONATIONS are needed to assist volunteers who make chemo caps for local hospital patients. Volunteers are also needed to knit/crochet chemo caps. Volunteers are an important part of cancer support at our local hospitals.

KITCHEN volunteers are needed at local agency to help prepare food for daily lunch and after-school program and to serve lunchtime meal. Volunteer hours are from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Volunteers must be at least 15 years old.

INSTRUCTOR volunteers are needed by local agency to teach educational courses such as Basic Aid Training, First Aid for Children, Babysitter's Training and CPR Training. Class time varies. Volunteers must be at least 15 years old.

FLYER DISTRIBUTOR volunteers are needed to post materials in local area shops, libraries, fitness centers, etc., for local foundation. All ages welcome.

MEDICAL DELIVERY volunteers are needed to deliver medical supplies to patient's homes and other hospital locations. Volunteers needed between 2:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. Volunteers must use personal vehicle and have a valid driver's license and car insurance.

AFTERCARE volunteers are needed to take care of donors after they have donated blood. They will serve cookies & juice and talk to the donor to watch for adverse reactions. Various times and locations are available. Must be at least 15 years old.
