HISTORICAL RESEARCHERS are needed by local agency to conduct research in context with what has happened in the world, in Michigan and in our community. Activities include research, writing, scanning, compilation, and editing. The end result will be a “coffee table” style book of the history of the agency.

REFRESHMENT EXPRESS cart volunteers are needed by local organization to take a cart filled with coffee, soda, and food to family waiting rooms, and staff/physician lounges to meet the needs of those who cannot conveniently access cafeterias. Must be at least 16 years old.

RESALE SHOP Volunteers needed to help staff load and unload donations for resale shop, once a week.

WINDOW DISPLAY DESIGNER Volunteer will create window displays as well as interior displays of merchandise for resale shop.

GARDENING ASSISTANT Gardening Assistant for Historic Ring Home Garden to assist with clean up, weeding, spraying, lawncare.

OFFICE HELP is needed by local organization label post cards, help with bulk mailings and make copies. Must be at least 13 years old. Hours are flexible.

BOOK SALE WORKER (BAY COUNTY) Setting up the Friends of the Libraries book sale, manning it during the run of the sale and tearing it down at the end of the sale.

READING MENTOR volunteers are needed to provide individualized reading time with students to help children learn to read and practice their reading skills. Mentors convey positive values that young children need to succeed and encourage children to view reading as a pleasurable experience.

ENTERTAINMENT volunteers are needed to perform, play music, sing and share their talents during a family friendly entertainment time on the weekends at local museum. Available hours are Saturday from 10am-5pm and Sunday from 12pm-5pm. Family volunteers are welcome.

HOSPICE volunteers are needed by local organization to visit with patients, sing and/or play a musical instrument, sew, bake, help out in the office, and assist with activities. These are just a few examples of how a volunteer can spread their “angel wings.” Only a couple of hours a month are required.
