### Golden Voice Choir Contributes to Hymnal Project

When Valley's Golden Voice Choir Director Mr. Paul Eschmann was contacted about participating in the Hymnal Project the answer was an excited, "yes"!

The Hymnal Project, started in 2017, is a resource of the Michigan District of the LCMS tasked with creating new arrangements of traditional hymns in a variety of musical styles.

Peter Prochnow, Director of Worship Arts and Community Engagement for the Michigan District and leader of the Hymnal Project, was looking for a group to record choral arrangements. So he turned to Dr. Boonenberg of Concordia University, Ann Arbor and Mr. Eschmann.

"Both conductors got to conduct during the recording session, and they worked well together," said Prochnow, "and the kids did a great job!"

"We were thrilled to be a part of this project!", Mr. Eschmann said. "To do what we do with excellence so that Christ is clearly seen in every aspect is our philosophy of music. To have this platform to share Christ in a new and powerful way, reaching far beyond the walls of our school, was an amazing opportunity."



The recordings made by the Hymnal Project are used in all kinds of ways by churches; they've also been used on radio shows, and a video taken during a recording session was shown at the end of the recent Church Worker Conference.

While originally created to be a resource for the churches of the Michigan District, the website has been accessed by 30 different countries.
