

VALLEY LUTHERAN SUMMER CAMP SAFETY PROTOCOLS



Valley Lutheran High School is committed to providing a great summer day camp experience while keeping the health and safety of our campers and leaders at the forefront. To that end, we have implemented the following safety protocols that are inline with Executive Orders of the Governor of Michigan and guidelines put in place by the Michigan High School Athletic Association (MHSAA) dated June 2, 2020.

ALL CAMPERS

- Parents and guardians are responsible for monitoring their children for the symptoms of COVID-19, including fever (over 100.4), persistent dry cough, shortness of breath, headache, sore throat, congestion, and runny nose. Children should be kept home from camp activities if these symptoms are present, or if fever reducing medication has been taken to reduce a fever in the last 48 hours.
- Children should be kept home if they have been in recent contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 or has symptoms of COVID-19.
- Upon arriving at Valley each day campers will check-in with a Valley Lutheran camps leader and have their temperature taken. Parents must stay on site until after the camper has been cleared to participate for the day.
- All campers, parents, and staff are required to wear masks. During camp activities, especially high intensity aerobic activity, or at times when appropriate social distance can be maintained, masks may be removed if chosen.
- Campers must bring their own full water bottle. Water bottles will not be shared.
- Campers need to maintain social distancing of 6 feet when not involved in activities.

SPORTS CAMPS

- Shirts and proper athletic wear are to be worn at all times, for example, boys should not take off shirts.
- To ensure germs are not spread, athletes are encouraged not to spit.
- Individual clothing/towels should not be shared and must be washed after each camp day.

PROGRAM

- Camp leaders will have hand sanitizer available for camper use.
- Camp leaders will have disinfectant and paper towels to disinfect surfaces and shared equipment at reasonable increments and at the end of each camp day.
- The restrooms inside the cafeteria will be open. One camper is allowed inside at a time. The restrooms will be disinfected daily.
- If a camper begins to develop symptoms of COVID-19 while at camp they will be immediately separated from others and parents/guardians will be contacted to pick them up.
